2	(5) 1991 Te Mata Awatea (5) 1991 Te Mata Awatea Hawkes Bay (IN) Awatea takes its name from the legendary ship SS Awatea (a Maori word meaning "Eye of the Dawn") that sailed the Auckland - Sydney - Wellington route in the late 1930's. The Awatea was requisitioned as a troop transport in WWII and was sunk off Algeria in 1942. The 1991 Awatea Cabernet/Merlot was harvested between the 4th and the 26th April. The grapes, drawn from several blocks close to the winery, were hand-harvested, then fermented in individual lots using techniques such as cap plunging and extended maceration. Following pressing the wine was aged for nineteen months in 225 litre barrels, half of them new, during which time it was progressively blended. 1991 Awatea Cabernet/Merlot is a blend of 56% Cabernet Sauvignon, 34% Merlot and 10% Cabernet Franc. It has a deep ruby colour, an aroma of plums and berries with suggestions of mint and cedar. It has a full palate with long, firm tannins. Est. 40 - 50

The purity is striking and the freshness is impressive; very young and very vibrant. The palate has plenty of layering and is nicely set to develop and build. The tannins are fully ripe and well composed, gently grippy but full of life and energy. Fruit flavors follow the aromas and run super deep, carrying long and even. Great wine, even greater in time. On the nose, the concentrated cassis and plum characters combine with the lifted violets to give more of a right bank style Bordeaux blend, a sign the significant Merlot proportion in this particular Larose. The oak integrates to provide pencil shavings and mocha notes, and supports the fruit weight effectively. The wine is has a firm structure and is quite tight at present from the natural acidity. Quantities of fruit were good and the resulting wine is considered an excellent Larose. Encépagement: Cabernet Sauvignon 72%, Merlot 14%, Cabernet Franc 7%, Malbec 5%, Petit Verdot 2% Dense, youthful colour. Very rich, dark berry flavours to the fore, with mint and leather characters adding complexity. Excellent weight and concentration. Est. 100 - 150

Encépagement: Cabernet Sauvignon 49%, Malbec 30%, Petit Verdot 9%, Merlot 7%, Cabernet Franc 5% Dark fruits, tobacco and mocha notes on the nose with some leathery complexity underneath. 16	(3) 2002 Te Mata Coleraine (3) 2002 Te Mata Coleraine Hawkes Bay Coleraine 2002 is made from grapes that were hand harvested from Te Mata's vineyards between the 25th March and the 22nd April 2002. The individual parcels of fruit were separately fermented in open-topped tanks to allow plunging of the cap. The resulting wines then underwent extended maceration on skins before racking and pressing off to barrel. During their time in barrel the wines were regularly topped and racked. The individual wines were blended in January 2003 and transferred to the 2nd year underground cellar for a further year of maturation. The final wine was egg-white fined and then bottled in late December 2003. Coleraine 2002 is a deep crimson colour with aromas of dried currants and spice. The palate shows rich flavours of dark plums, chocolate and bramble with an underpinning of cedar and coffee that flows through the long palate and firm tannin finish. Coleraine 2002 is a blend of 25% Cabernet Sauvignon, 39% Merlot and 36% Cabernet Franc Est. 80 - 130

It was then bottled in December, 1996. Coleraine 1995 has a dark crimson/purple colour, an aroma of spice, liquorice and cedar, with a concentrated palate of rich, ripe berries and smoke with big, soft tannins. Coleraine 1995 is a blend of 59% cabernet sauvignon, 34% merlot and 7% cabernet franc Est. 80 - 130

Soil moisture levels were high due to recurring rain. Saving the day, April really pulled one out of the bag. Although days were not particularly hot, there was enough sunshine to slowly accumulate flavour and to round and soften the tannins and phenolics, producing elegant wines with slightly lower alcohols. GDD 950. Coolest season for a long time. But a settled autumn. Mid cherry red. Compact with a real sense of depth and much more to come. Has the classic Ata Rangi smoky/savoury aroma along with the still-fresh fruit and more spice here. Juicy and rich-fruited on the palate and mouth-watering on the long finish.
