The owners, Lois and Stephen Peter took special pride in their wine selection and, as a result, built quite a collection, even winning the 1992 Decanter Robert Mondavi Award for best wines by the glass in the Far East. Sadly, the restaurant is no longer but the cellar lives on...In the 1990s, as a direct result of winning the Decanter Robert Mondavi award, Lois and Stephen were invited to a private lunch with Robert Mondavi at his California winery who presented them with a six pack of Opus One. Although the best was yet to come. As part of the prize, a jeroboam of 1979 Robert Mondavi Reserve Cabernet was flown some 6000 miles from the US to New Zealand. Tragically, it did not survive the transit, falling from its packaging and concussing an unfortunate courier in the process. On hearing the news, Mondavi sent out a replacement bottle from his own private cellar. It did, of course, make the local news. Rest assured, no further couriers were harmed. Although Mondavi's 1979 wine was outshone by the first ever vintage of Opus One, it is far from down and out. In the words of Jonathon Alsop, from his book Wine Lover's Devotional: "Mondavi's 1979 Cabernet Sauvignon and Opus One's 1979 premier vintage are still legendary California wines ... the man who lived by the motto, 'quality, quality, quality'." And by the time Champerele finally received the precious jeroboam, there were, as reported by local news, fewer than 10 bottles left. Now? Who can say?
